







## **Undergraduate Admissions Funnel**



The incoming cohort may differ from the admissions enrolled number above, since these numbers are measured at different times.



## **Undergraduate Enrollment Trends**






In 2019-20, Institutional Research began calculating the student-faculty ratio according to undergraduate and graduate level to provide a better description of the student experience. It is important to note that the student faculty ratio does not reflect the average classroom enrollment, but rather is a description of the resources available to meet a demand.


Faculty who teach in both undergraduate and graduate courses are placed in the level which dominates their fall schedule for purposes of student faculty ratio. If the number of courses is equal in both levels, the student headcount will break the tie. All PT faculty are classed as graduate.


The student faculty ratio for both undergraduate and graduate levels is displayed using the formula dictated by the Common Data Set: Student FTE/ Faculty FTE.


The FTE calculation takes the number of part-time students \*.33 and adds this to the number of full time students. The same formula provides the faculty FTE.





